ONCE A CATHOLIC . .

As we hear frequently about the majority of baptised Catholics who rarely or never practice their faith in the traditional way of participation in the Eucharistic community of the church through Sunday Mass, I started to wonder just what people go through when they "leave their faith", as we say. Do they actually make a decision or do they just drift away without purpose or reason?

People leave the Church for many reasons. Some leave because of boredom, indifference, ignorance and misunderstanding of the basic beliefs of the Church, anger and hurt – real or perceived – caused by representatives of the Church, anger at God and a variety of other reasons. Relatively few people leave because of theological reasons. Most people drift away during their high school or university years while they are struggling with their life choices and searching for their own identity. Often they don't see the relevance of the Church in their lives because they are focussed on finding and preparing for their life long career and determining their direction in life.

Many leave the Church because they simply move to a new area and never make the effort to find a new parish, or some leave when they marry someone from a different faith or without any religious affiliation.

Whatever the myriad of reasons people leave, I firmly believe most non-practicing Catholics would prefer to return, they just don't know how. They are afraid to approach the church because they are afraid of being rejected. To those on the outside of the Church, it is perceived as a closed system, and being on the outside is a lonely place to be. Many are especially concerned about their status and mistakenly think they have been excommunicated and are not allowed to come back.

Before we attempt to discover ways by which we can welcome back those who have moved away, we must first ask "To what are we welcoming them? Are we actually a community that people would want to be part of, and how do we make this welcoming community known to them? Do we sit in Church and wait for them or do we take some steps towards being where they are? Tough questions, real questions. Questions that a community that honestly seeking to be truly Catholic has to ask. We have a responsibility to lighten the load and shorten the journey back for people who feel, awkward, fearful and hesitant about once again continuing the journey with us. Let's leave the moralising and judging for those without sin.
